She is the author of many articles and five books, including: Cultural Proficiency, Culturally Proficient Instruction and Culturally Proficient Responses to the LGBT Communities.

On May 11, 2013, she received the **Ellis Island Medal of Honor**, presented annually by the National Ethnic Coalition of Organizations. Honorees "exemplify outstanding qualities in both their personal and professional lives, while continuing to preserve the richness of their particular heritage."
